ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Many Schaeffer students receive AP credit through testing because of the rigor of existing coursework. In the Class of 2017, 57% of students took at least one AP exam. There were four AP Scholars, three AP Scholars with Honors and two AP Scholars with Distinction.

THE SCHOOL

Schaeffer Academy is in its twenty-fifth year. Begun in 1993 by a group of parents in Rochester, Minnesota, the school is named after Dr. Francis Schaeffer, a Christian philosopher, theologian and evangelist. The school's educational philosophy reflects his emphasis on a Christian worldview, which permeates all areas of life.

The school has grown from 78 students in grades kindergarten through six to 276 students in grades kindergarten through twelve. The Class of 2018 will be Schaeffer Academy's eighteenth graduating class.

Schaeffer Academy is governed by a Board of Directors, made up of present and former school parents.

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WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A CHRISTIAN AND CLASSICAL SCHOOL

Schaeffer Academy's primary purpose is to provide a Christ-centered and classical education which emphasizes rigorous academics in the liberal arts. As a Christ-centered school, all subjects are taught within a Christian worldview. As a classical school, the method of instruction is the Trivium – a system of education in use since the Middle Ages. In the younger grades students are first taught the grammar (the facts and rules) of each subject. Logic or dialectic follows, teaching students to fit together the facts and rules in order to produce a cohesive whole. Upper School students incorporate rhetoric – learning how to communicate clearly the knowledge acquired through grammar and logic. Schaeffer Academy's students graduate able to think clearly, reason soundly, write gracefully, and live faithfully.

FACULTY AND CLASS SIZE

Schaeffer Academy has an experienced and committed faculty of 27 full and part-time teachers for grades kindergarten through twelve. There are 20 teachers for the Upper School, with a current enrollment of 139 in grades 7 through 12. The student to teacher ratio in the Upper School is 7:1. All Upper School teachers are degreed in their field, while twelve hold Master's degrees and two, doctorates.

ACCREDITATION/AFFILIATIONS

Schaeffer Academy is accredited by the Association of Classical and Christian Schools (ACCS). Membership is also held in the ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International).

NATIONAL MERIT

From all graduating classes (2001-2017), comprising 262 students, Schaeffer Academy has produced twelve National Merit Finalists, one Semi-Finalist, and 21 Commended Scholars, an average of 13% of our graduates.

SOME COMMENTS ABOUT COURSEWORK AND REQUIREMENTS

College level texts are used in Physics, Algebra II, Chemistry, Pre-Calculus, Calculus and Spanish, while the humanities courses include substantial reading in original texts. Major writing or research projects are required throughout high school. Annual Science and History Fairs require students to produce projects with National History Day guidelines in 8th and 10th grades, and projects suitable for the Regional and State Science Fairs in 7th, 9th and 11th grades. Latin is required through grade 9, while Spanish is taught in 10th, 11th and 12th. Latin students take the National Latin Exam annually. In the past eighteen years Schaeffer students have won 106 gold medals, including seven for perfect papers.

EXTRACURRICULARS

Schaeffer Academy offers the following sports: Girls Varsity Soccer; Boys Varsity Soccer; Boys and Girls Cross Country; Girls Varsity and JV Volleyball; Girls Varsity and JV Basketball; Boys Varsity and JV Basketball; Girls Varsity Softball; Boys Varsity Baseball; Boys and Girls Track and Field; Boys and Girls Varsity Tennis. Many Upper School students also participate in Choir, Band and Strings and our Drama productions. We also have a Lego Robotics Club.

COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE

Schaeffer has graduated 262 students since 2001. Of these, the majority have gone to four year colleges.
